**Subject:** Government's proposed questions

The government respectfully proposes the following series of questions to be asked of Juror #7 regarding his handwritten note appended to the jury note dated 8/27 at 11:25:

1. Did you write this note?

2. Does it accurately reflect your views?

[If yes,]

3. Is it your intention to adhere to your position as stated in this note during your deliberations?

The government proposes the following series of questions to be asked of Juror #7 regarding the "quotes" raised in the subsequent undated jury note:

1. I have before me a jury note that states that you made the following statements: "This case is a joke case. No one died."; "She (Lisa) demanded too much."; and "I don't treat this case seriously." Did you make those statements?

2. Do they accurately reflect your views?

3. Did you make these statements to your fellow jurors after I repeated the instruction that you must follow the law as I have given it to you?

In addition, based on the note dated 8/27 at 13:35, the government believes that it may be appropriate to question Juror #7 about whether and when he has accessed or been exposed to extraneous information about this case, as well as whether he holds a bias against the federal government.
